



DETECT & REPAIR LEAKS




DID YOU KNOW?

Household leaks not only drive up your utility bill, but also causes damage to your home and impacts public water supply.

For example:


7 Gallon/hour




1. Leak Detection by Utility Bill

First, please check your utility bill.

If you notice an unusual spike in your consumption, you may have a leak.


2. Leak Detection by Water Meter

Next, please check the leak detector in your water meter. If leak detector continues to rotate when you have all water tap turned off at home, you may have a leak.



3. Leak Detection by Toilet Test

Next, please take a few minutes to do a toilet test. Put a few drops of food coloring into the tank and let it sit for 10 mins. If color shows up in the bowl, you have a leak.






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4. Leak Point Identification in Toilet Tank

Old or worn-out toilet flappers (e.g. valve seal) can cause leaks. Flappers are inexpensive rubber parts that can build up minerals or decay over time. Replace if needed.



6. Leak Point Identification in Shower

A showerhead leaking at 10 drips per minute wastes more than 500 gallons per year. Some leaky showerheads can be fixed by making sure there is a tight connection between the showerhead and the pipe stem and by using pipe tape to secure it. Pipe tape, also called Teflon tape, is available at most hardware stores, is easy to apply, and can help control leaks.



5. Leak Point Identification in Faucet

One of the most common causes of a leaking faucet is a damaged O rubber ring. The ring works to stop water from going through the valve when water is turned off. Replace if damaged. It is much cheaper than replacing the entire faucet.



7. Other Leak Points in Your Home

Please check other common leak points listed below:

- Bathtub Spout
- Under the Sink
- Appliances (Dishwasher, Refrigerator, Washer, Water Heater, etc.)

8. CAN'T LOCATE LEAK?

If you can't identify the leak point, you may have a break in your water pipes.

Property owners are responsible for the repair, maintenance and replacement of all water pipes and fixtures up to the water meter.
